Grandparents & Special Friends Day



Sterne Pride: Alumni to Watch *Akiva Resnikoff*

Akiva Resnikoff (Sterne '95 - '98) has found a niche - both for himself and for the cookie industry. He is founder and COO of *The Cookie Department*, a Bay Area firm that makes "functional cookies". Each cookie has a function from packing a protein punch to supplying natural detoxifiers.

After working in the functional beverage industry for several years Akiva decided that he wanted to do something from the ground-up in the food industry. He took a classic product, the cookie, and fortified it. It all began with the "Awaken Baked Cookie", a caffeine-infused cookie made with organic coffee. The company has since launched a complete functional cookie line. For descriptions go to: thecookiedepartment.com.

Akiva was the first to create the new functional trend in the cookie market. This was five years ago, and now *The Cookie Department* has products in 250 stores on the west coast and scattered across the country. He expects to grow by 250% this year.

Akiva, who has fond memories of Sterne, attended the school from seventh through ninth grades. After Sterne he transferred to Berkeley High School. He says that going from the small classes at Sterne to a highly populated high school was a real shock. When he was nineteen-years-old Akiva attended culinary school in Oakland and earned his pastry certificate.

The teachers at Sterne made a difference in Akiva's education. He was greatly influenced by his favorite teacher, Mynai Butler, who passed away last August. "I learned and absorbed the most from Mynai," Akiva remembers warmly. "There was a real Sterne approach."
