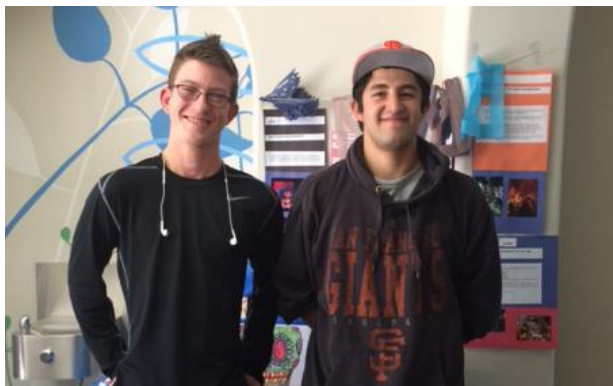

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Sterne Pride: Alumni to Watch *Lawrence Ellison*

Lawrence (Larry) Ellison (*Sterne* '85-'88) has been giving back ever since he left *Sterne* twenty-six years ago. Larry has made a successful career in education and is currently a third grade teacher at St. Gabriel School in San Francisco. But it was a long and varied road that finally led Larry to his present position. Along the way he was always involved with helping and caring for people.

After *Sterne*, Larry briefly attended Major League Baseball Umpiring School. This was followed by a stint at Seminary School where he studied to be a priest. It was at the Seminary that Larry began working with gang members and the homeless. For three years he counseled, mediated, and advocated for families. From this he realized that he loved working with kids.

In pursuit of further education, Larry went to San Francisco State earning a Bachelors degree in Liberal Studies with a minor in American Sign Language. With the goal of becoming a teacher, Larry stayed at SF State and earned a teaching credential with a minor in Special Education. First teaching in East Palo Alto, then at Our Lady of Visitation (his alma mater before *Sterne*), Larry eventually taught in almost every grade. Armed with this broad experience he decided to become a principal.

To prepare for a career in administration he attended Arizona State and graduated top of the class with a 4.2 GPA and a Masters Degree in Education

Administration. Larry is back teaching and would like to pursue work as an administrator. But for now, he says he's just not ready to leave the classroom.

Some of Larry's students have Learning Differences and working with them has become not only a professional specialty but also a passion. "It has always been the closest thing to my heart," he says. "It is because of *Sterne* School that I am where I am. I tell this to parents who don't want their kids to go to a *special school*. But I'm not embarrassed. I'm very open and it gets the parents to open up. I have nothing but thanks for *Sterne* School."

Inside LD: Paths Forward *Preparing our Students for the Future*

On October 8th, the Inside LD community gathered at *Sterne* High School for an evening exploring academic options for students AFTER high school graduation. Jani Ross, a partner in the education consulting firm McClure, Mallory, Baron & Ross, provided detailed information about the college application process. Jani shared specific strategies for parents and students who are targeting schools that serve students with learning differences.

Former *Sterne* parent, Sue Brown, and her daughter, Caitlin'09, discussed the college search process from the parent/student perspective. The evening concluded with attendees visiting with representatives from various colleges, test prep services, and post-secondary support programs.
